Corrections in Front Matter

Introduction, page xxi and footnote 52:

The four-part Amen, Wq 210, is not lost. A unique copy survives in D-Hj, XXV (1). It is published in CPEB:CW, V/6.1.

Introduction, page xix and footnote 45:

Regarding the first performance of Wq 216, after further inquiries made in February and March 2020:

Marina Demina, the current librarian of Musik- och teaterbiblioteket, confirmed that there is no listing of the score of Wq 216 in their catalogue, nor in the Bernadottebiblioteket of the Royal Palace Library in Stockholm.

Anna Fredriksson, Special Collections at Uppsala University Library, checked Gustav III's papers and did not find any reference to the performance or score.

Mats Hemström, Senior Archivist and Keeper of the Royal Palace Archives, Swedish National Archives, checked the following records: (1) accounts of the Royal Court for 1770–1771; (2) the series Resor, vol. 27 (regarding the return of Gustav III from France to Sweden in April and May 1771); and (3) the Swedish National Archives in Marieberg, Statskontoret, Kansliet AI a: vols. 108–109, Protokoll 1770–1771; C I: vols. 70–71 Diarium 1770–1771; C 3: vols. 90–91 Expeditionslistor 1770–1771. He could not find any documentation regarding the concert or the score.

Critical Report, page 120, left column, add:

3. *Arie*

This aria was borrowed from the *Einführungsmusik Schaffer*, H 821m, where it was originally set for tenor instead of bass (cf. CPEB:CW, V/3.5).
